Santina Hack, the "Original Volunteer"

Santina Hack, a longtime resident of Tarrytown, died on June 18, 2011 at 100 years of age.

As a new volunteer in 2002 I had the privilege and pleasure of meeting and volunteering with Santina, who at that time assisted in the office of the Director of Volunteers. As a much experienced volunteer of many years, Santina was very helpful in answering any questions that I might have had. She had volunteered in many departments during her tenure and was familiar with almost all areas in the hospital.

It was interesting to learn that Santina was the very first volunteer at Phelps Memorial Hospital and remained a devoted volunteer for over 50 years, logging over 52,200 hours. She was also a charter member of the Hospital's Auxiliary, serving as treasurer for many years as well as holding other offices in the Auxiliary. On April 9, 2001, the Village of Tarrytown honored her by proclaiming the day "Santina Hack Day" in honor of her dedication and loyalty to the hospital and the community.

Santina and her husband, Bob Hack, who also was a volunteer, often joined me for lunch. We had many lively and delightful conversations about art. Bob was a talented artist and had won numerous awards for his paintings. Although Santina was not an artist herself, she loved art and was proud of Bob's art exhibitions and shows in galleries in New York and Connecticut as well as a show in Phillipsburg consisting of beautiful water colors of our historic Hudson Valley. Bob passed away on Sept. 4, 2011 at 97 years old.
