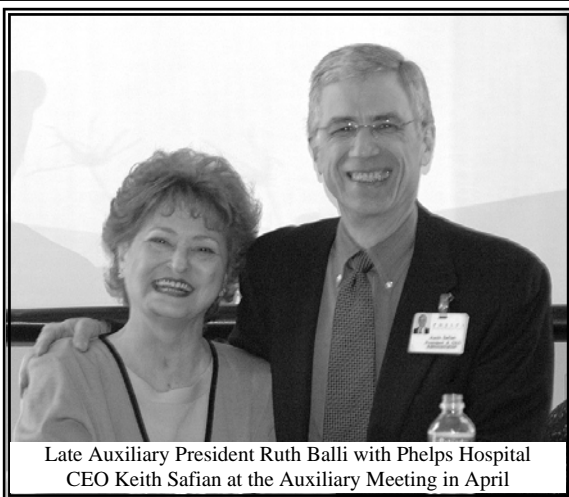

Good Bye to a Good Friend Ruth Balli, Auxiliary President

Ruth had served as President of the Auxiliary on three different occasions and was currently the Co President of the Auxiliary at her passing. At one point she also served as 1st Vice President and could be seen at all the Bake Sales not only as a seller, but also as a baker of delicious brownies and chocolate chip cookies.

Ruth's contributions to the Auxiliary and the hospital were too numerous to detail, but she attended the Phelps Board meetings and was also on the M&E Committee of the hospital. She also initiated the Heads Up program which, in effect, had children put medical information about themselves in their bicycle helmets.

Ruth served as Co-chair of the Information Desk from 1995-1998, and worked as a Patient Rep and also in the Gift Shop. She was a strong and forward-thinking leader, a people person, a visionary for the Auxiliary and the Hospital. Ruth will be sorely missed by all who knew her.

MARILYN ROSENBLATT BREGMAN

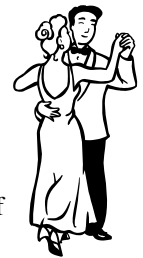

New Volunteer Website

Not yet, but soon..... if you go to Phelpshospital.org, you will notice a new website with easy access to a section on Volunteers. This will include a description of volunteer services, a letter to prospective volunteers and an on-line application. This is another step into the 21st century!

Signing in on a Touch-Screen

Beginning on January 1, 2006, all our volunteers put away their pencils and papers which have been replaced by a new touch-screen computer for signing in and recording volunteer hours worked. Now, with the touch of a button, we know how many hours each volunteer has worked in a given month, and in which area they volunteered. We are no longer using our fingers or even a calculator. Although a challenge a first, just about everyone is now becoming computer efficient and enjoying the new system.....kudos to everyone!

Newborn Hearing

For the past year-and-a-half Volunteer Services, in conjunction with Sue Reilly, MS, CCC-A, the hospital audiologist, has offered the opportunity for volunteers to be trained to test the hearing of newborns. There are approximately 1200 births at Phelps Hospital every year, and each baby's hearing is tested within 24 hours of birth. The testing is automated and takes only a few minutes. Babies who do not pass the screening are referred for further testing. If there is a hearing loss, babies as young as only a few months can benefit from wearing hearing aids.

The program has been a big help to the nurses who used to be responsible for all the testing. It has also provided a rewarding volunteer experience to those who have been trained. The volunteers love the nursery, they love the babies and they love the opportunity to provide a vital service to the hospital.

Cherry Door Annual Luncheon

On March 30th, with nearly everyone in attendance, we had our annual Cherry Door luncheon at the Main Street Café in Tarrytown. It was a beautiful day, lunch was delicious. We'd like to extend kudos to Donna Goldsmith, who has chaired the Cherry Door for the past two years, for a job well done.
